Once feedback has been collected, the school will develop a statement that will be taken to school council for final approval. It is theintention that this process be compelted by the end of this school year.

# **Buildings and Grounds Update.**

I am pleased to announce the following developments to APPS Buildings and Grounds program:

#### **Courtyard Shade Structure**

I would like to upate the school community on a project that has bene in process for almost 12 months. As many of you would be aware, during the upgrade of the new building we lost the large undercover area within the courtyard. It has been a primary focus of the school during this time to develop the most suitable plan to protection from the sun and rain.

The commencement of the project is impacted by current COVID restrictions, however, we are hopeful the project will be completed in time for the commencement of the 2021 school year.

Below is a basic image of the stucture that will be built in the courtyard space. The tables should give you some point of reference.



#### **Upgrades to Music Studio**

The school has been working through department procedures to gain funding to repair the roof ad ceiling of the music studio. Although you may not have noticed directly, the space has been in need of repairs for some time.

The school has managed to secure funding to replace and upgrading the roof, ceiling and internal walls of the building. This process, which the school would have otherwise needed to fund, will in turn save the school approximately \$35,000 dollars from our school based budget.
