APPS Canteen Says "No!" To Plastic Packaging

We have now eliminated virtually all oil-based plastics from Canteen packaging, including freezer bags and cling wrap. Even our pizza and burger boxes are made from sugarcane and are 100% biodegradable in home compost, while our disposable gloves are 100% biodegradable in landfill. We also use unbleached paper napkins and bags, wooden cutlery, recyclable foil bags, and BioCups which are made from paperboard paper and lined with plant-based bioplastics, not oil-based. These cups can be commercially composted making them carbon-neutral, however, Maroondah is yet to offer this service.

Although every caution is taken to reduce the risk of cross-contamination, we cannot guarantee that any of our products are safe to consume for people with soy, dairy, egg or gluten allergies.

Our canteen is a healthy canteen, serving mainly "green" every day healthy foods including salad ingredients from the school's kitchen garden, grown and picked by our students. Some "amber" occasional foods are also served, recognising canteen is also a treat for students and their families. As well as looking after our students, we are looking after our environment by reducing packaging, especially plastics. Most packaging is biodegradable, but the best efforts will be from families providing re-usable lunch order bags and cups with lids, available to purchase through the Office. Thank-you!
