Health and Safety – COVID-19

I sincerely thank our families for their continuing support of measures to keep our school safe. Twice weekly RATs, paired with increased ventilation, outside learning where possible, masks, air purifiers, physical distancing where possible, and hygiene routines will help mitigate the risk of COVID in our school. I very much thank those families who have kept their children at home if unwell, COVID positive or isolating as a close contact. These measures will go a long way to protecting the health and safety of our community and keeping our school open.








F-2 Studio
