NAPLAN testing

Next week, our Year 3 and 5 students will be undertaking National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) testing for 2022. Students' skills in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions, (spelling, punctuation, and gramma) and Numeracy will be assessed. This year, most components of NAPLAN will be taken online. Students have completed some test runs to familiarize them with online testing.

Individual student NAPLAN reports will be forwarded to families later in the year. They are not a definitive or comprehensive assessment of what your child can do; rather a "snapshot" of student achievement. Thank you to Mitch, who is coordinating and organising our NAPLAN testing.

Change in COVID requirements

Face masks, while recommended, are no longer mandatory in any school setting. This means students in grades 3 to 6, staff and visitors in primary schools are no longer required to wear face masks. Any student or staff member who wishes to wear a mask may do so, including those who are medically at-risk.

Parents, carers and other adult visitors (not performing work) are no longer required to show evidence of two doses of COVID-19 vaccine. Please note that if you are working with children at school, you are required to be triple vaxxed.

Students and staff who have tested positive for COVID-19, and have completed their 7-day isolation period, now do not need to undertake rapid antigen test (RAT) screening for 12 weeks after their release from isolation. This was previously 8 weeks.

Students and staff who are household contacts of a COVID-19 case are no longer required to quarantine. They can return to school as long as they undertake rapid antigen tests (RAT) 5 times within their 7-day period and wear face masks indoors if they are aged 8 and above unless they have a valid exemption.

The Victorian Government has announced it is extending the RAT screening program for the first 4 weeks of Term 2. Thank you to all students and families who have played their role in regularly testing – we know that it hasn't been easy.

RATs were sent home at the end of Term 1 for Weeks 1&2 of Term 2, and again, sent home yesterday and today for Weeks 3&4 of this term. At this stage, we do not have any further information as to whether this distribution of RATs will continue after Week 4.

As we approach winter and flu season, the vaccination of children aged 5 to 11 and booster shots for students 16+ remains the best way to ensure protection for students and staff. The Easter break is a good opportunity to get your child vaccinated ahead of this, with many options across GPs, pharmacies and the state run vaccination clinics.

If you have any concerns or worries about getting your child vaccinated, please get in contact with your GP or another health professional who can answer your concerns.

What to do if your child tests positive

Please report the positive case through the Student COVID-19 Test Portal Login (educationapps.vic.gov.au) or you can notify the school in writing or by phone. You must also report your child's positive test to the Department of Health via the COVID-19 Positive Rapid Antigen Test Self-Reporting Form COVID-19 Positive Rapid Antigen Test Self-Reporting Form Department of Health Portal (powerappsportals.com) or call centre on 1800 675 398.


FROM THE F-2 STUDIO














FROM THE 3,4,5 STUDIO

They also had the chance to view 'Tycho Goes to Mars' in the Planetarium and spend time indulging in the sensory experience 'Beyond Perception.'













Year 6 Studio
