Our survey results showed an increase of parent satisfaction for the school, which was great to see.

From the Foundation to Level 2 Studio



Works notification



Croydon Station closure and 24-hour works in January and February 2024

Work is powering ahead to make the Lilydale Line level crossing free by 2024, a year ahead of schedule.

Construction is well underway to remove the congested level crossing and roundabout by elevating the rail line, building a new Croydon Station and transport hub, and creating new road connections to connect Croydon's town

What we're doing

We'll work day and night along the rail corridor and at the Coolstore Road level crossing from 7.30pm Tuesday 30 January until 7am Saturday 3 February 2024.

During this time, we will:

- Demolish Croydon Station platform and remove redundant station services
- Install delineation fencing in the rail corridor
- Trench and install underground and overhead rail equipment
- Continue building bridge foundations (including piling and concrete pours to construct piers and crossheads)
- Undertake rail signalling works
- Relocate underground utility services, including water
- Undertake geotechnical investigations in the rail corridor, including beside Lincoln Road Service Road
- Undertake sewer relocation works
- Investigate services.

Some of these activities will continue during regular construction hours in February following this 24/7 works period.

Croydon Station closure

In order to build the new transport hub, Croydon Station will close from Tuesday 30 January until the new station opens by spring 2024. All station facilities will be unavailable, including the station office and myki facilities. Further updates will be provided as works progress.

During this time, Lilydale line trains will not stop at Croydon Station. A shuttle bus will be in operation, connecting passengers from Croydon to train services at Mooroolbark and Ringwood East stations.

The last train will stop at Croydon Station at around 8:30pm on Tuesday 30 January. Keep an eye out for special community events aligned with our works by signing up for email updates at levelcrossings.vic.gov.au/subscribe

What to expect

There will be some moderate construction noise from machinery. There will also be an increase in workers, vehicles, and construction equipment.



- Construction vehicles will access the rail corridor via Coolstore Road, Railway Crescent, the Devon Street site compound, Gallipoli Parade, Wicklow Avenue and Lincoln Road service road.
- Coolstore Road will remain open for the duration of the 24-hour works, with stop-slow traffic management in place to safely facilitate hi-rail movements across the rail line. This will result in delays of up to 15 minutes.
- Traffic management staff will be in place throughout the works to ensure the safety of road users and pedestrians.
- During night works, targeted lighting will be used for work areas with measures in place to prevent light spill.
- Access to homes and businesses will be maintained throughout the works.

Changes to the way you travel

Buses will replace trains on sections of the Belgrave and Lilydale lines, between Blackburn and Belgrave or Lilydale stations from 8.30pm Tuesday 30 January to last service Friday 2 February 2024.

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



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Sunscreen



The sun's ultraviolet radiation (UV) can cause skin and eye damage and skin cancer. You can't see or feel UV. It can be scattered and reflected so can reach you even in the shade. Whatever the weather, when the UV is 3 and above, use all five forms of sun protection.

Sun Protection Factor. Choose SPF30, 50 or 50+.

Application

Apply a generous amount of sunscreen to any skin not protected by clothing.

Apply sunscreen about 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapply every TWO hours or more frequently if sweating or in water.

AUST L

In Australia, sunscreens are regulated by the Australian Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA). Always check for the AUST L (Australia Licence) number.



Water Resistant

Four hours water resistance does not equal four hours UV protection. Always reapply after swimming.

Storage

To help keep sunscreen stable, store it below 30 degrees.

Expiry

Always check the date to make sure the sunscreen hasn't expired.

Broad Spectrum

Protects against UVA and UVB radiation.

Even when wearing a hat, apply sunscreen to help protect from scattered and reflected UV reaching the face, neck and ears.

DNA damage that causes skin cancer accumulates with repeated UV exposure. Apply sunscreen daily.
