

#### From Foundation

Our Foundations have enjoyed a wide variety of learning experiences over the past two weeks. We particularly enjoyed taking our writer's notebooks outside for inspiration.

We have also spent some time in maths connecting numbers to quantities and counting in sequence. The photos here show the Foundations viewing the story 'Ten Apples up on Top' by Dr. Seuss, and then responding with an activity (placing stickers to match the numbers for each animal).

In Inquiry, we have been exploring history through the lens of games and toys. This week we enjoyed a hands on exploration of the game of Hopscotch. We found out that Hopscotch began in the Roman Empire as means to train soldiers!










#### From Level 1 & 2

In Maths we begin our year with Number: counting and place value. Games are a fantastic way of building automaticity in a way that the students find engaging and fun. We've been exploring different ways of using 100's charts and by far the favourite has been 100s chart Battle Ship.





#### From Year 3

What a great fortnight!

We've enjoyed settling into the term and becoming more familiar with our classroom routines. We've learned some new maths games, nailed our 3 star independent reading expectations and enjoyed diving deeper into our inquiry topic this term - Australia's History.

We have also been working on expanding our narrative stories by starting with a plan and learning about 'plot mountain', where we are learning to expand our narrative stories into a clear beginning, middle and end. It's been lovely to see the year 3's developing their understanding of writing for an audience, and ways to engage our readers.

Lastly, we enjoyed participating in the basketball clinic last week where we had a special guest teach us some of the key basketball fundamental movement skills. We are looking forward to family fun night tonight and our conferences next week!








#### From Year 4/5

Our Inquiry unit is underway in the 4/5 Classroom. Students worked in small groups to analyse a picture depicting a scene from our history. During this session the groups came up with their own questions / wonderings about the image. We have since narrowed these down to our most important questions that will guide our research.









#### From Year 5/6

5/6 + Foundation/1 Buddies

With a new year and welcoming new students to our school brings new friendship opportunities. Our Buddy program is in full swing where our Year 5 students pair up with a Foundation student, and our Year 6 students pair up with Year 1 student (with most of our 1/6 pairings being last year's F/5 pairings). Buddy programs are an opportunity for our older students to demonstrate leadership, and for our younger students to have an older student to work with, ask questions, and have a familiar face in the playground. Our Buddy sessions run fortnightly. So far, buddies have created 'about me' profiles, and have read together in the Library. We look forward to a great year of Buddies ahead!

# Sunscreen



The sun's ultraviolet radiation (UV) can cause skin and eye damage and skin cancer. You can't see or feel UV. It can be scattered and reflected so can reach you even in the shade. Whatever the weather, when the UV is 3 and above, use all five forms of sun protection.

#### SPF

Sun Protection Factor. Choose SPF30, 50 or 50+.


#### Application

Apply a generous amount of sunscreen to any skin not protected by clothing.

Apply sunscreen about 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapply every TWO hours or more frequently if sweating or in water.

#### AUST L

In Australia, sunscreens are regulated by the Australian Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA). Always check for the AUST L (Australia Licence) number.



#### Water Resistant

Four hours water resistance does not equal four hours UV protection. Always reapply after swimming.

#### Storage

To help keep sunscreen stable, store it below 30 degrees.

#### Expiry

Always check the date to make sure the sunscreen hasn't expired.

#### **Broad Spectrum**

Protects against UVA and UVB radiation.

Even when wearing a hat, apply sunscreen to help protect from scattered and reflected UV reaching the face, neck and ears.

DNA damage that causes skin cancer accumulates with repeated UV exposure. Apply sunscreen daily.
