# **Dogs on School Grounds.**

For most primary schools, dogs are not permitted on school grounds. However, at APPS we do allow them on school grounds - with conditions. To ensure that our school remains a safe and inclusive place for everyone, we have in place a number of rules that we expect all families to follow if they wish to bring their pet dog onto school grounds:

- pet dogs must be **leashed at all times** and in the control of a responsible adult
- pet dogs **must not be tied up** on school grounds or left unaccompanied
- families that bring dogs to school that exhibit signs of aggressive behaviour, bark, or jump may be asked to remove the dog from school premises.
- owners are required to pick up their dogs waste
- dogs are not permitted in the courtyard or within three metres of the courtyard gate

- 2. Siblings of students currently enrolled
- 3. Students from outside of the school's zone.

### From Foundation


Our Foundation classroom has been a busy hive of learning for the last few weeks! In Maths, we have been learning about subitising (identifying how many in a small collection without counting each one) and we have been extending our understanding of single digit numbers (including how to write them and represent them with small collections).

In literacy, we have been learning new letters and sounds and this week we discovered that we have learnt enough sounds to start reading and writing some words! Our Foundations were super excited to find that they have the skills to decode, and even write these words now (almost as excited as their teachers!). We are very proud of how much they have learnt already.









### From Foundation and Level 1 & 2

Yesterday was a very full day for our F-2 Students. As part of our Inquiry topic we had a 'Toys in Time' incursion. Students learned about the earliest toys such as wooden spinning tops and knuckles, how and why Matchbox Cars were invented and had an hour of experiencing toys that children have played with through history.

During Kitchen Garden our Foundation students felt like they were digging up treasure. Our carrot crop was ready for harvesting! Some amazing colours and hilarious shapes emerged and today we're looking forward to tasting and comparing them. We are wondering whether purple, orange and white carrots taste any different!

### From Year 3

Year 3's have enjoyed a fun filled fortnight!

In Reading we've been exploring the topic of key words in preparation for our upcoming Naplan style comprehension next week. Students have enjoyed an opportunity to read passages together and locate key words they think are important to each paragraph.

In Writing, we've been digging deep into the persuasive style of writing. We've been learning about the difference between facts and opinions and how to provide our audience with convincing statements. With Friday being 'Free Dress Day', we had a fun class discussion about "if students should wear uniforms" then began creating a persuasive piece stating our personal opinions on the matter.

In Maths, we've been taking a refresher on skip counting and enjoyed spending sometime outside in the sunshine, turning our skip counting practise into a team building game of hopscotch. We've been learning lots about the "CUBES" method for answering worded problems, where we use different strategies to help us understand what maths the worded problem it asking us to do.

We hope everyone has a lovely long weekend ahead!









# From Year 4/5




## From Year 5/6

Gardening, cooking, and science often go hand-in-hand. In Kitchen Garden, 5/6A recently used some of our own grown produce to make a three-ingredient guacamole (the tomatoes were from our orchard, not the avocados!). Students were thrilled by how enjoyable the simple recipe was. But the learning and discovery will didn't end there. The seeds from the avocados used were kept and were then set up as an experiment in the classroom. Students hypothesised which method of growing avocado seeds would yield the fastest seed germination. It's been a week since the seeds were placed on the shelf in the classroom and students are monitoring closely for results.



# Sunscreen



The sun's ultraviolet radiation (UV) can cause skin and eye damage and skin cancer. You can't see or feel UV. It can be scattered and reflected so can reach you even in the shade. Whatever the weather, when the UV is 3 and above, use all five forms of sun protection.







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#### SPF

Sun Protection Factor. Choose SPF30, 50 or 50+.

#### Application

Apply a generous amount of sunscreen to any skin not protected by clothing.

Apply sunscreen about 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapply every TWO hours or more frequently if sweating or in water.

#### AUST L

In Australia, sunscreens are regulated by the Australian Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA). Always check for the AUST L (Australia Licence) number.



## **Water Resistant**

Four hours water resistance does not equal four hours UV protection. Always reapply after swimming.

#### Storage

To help keep sunscreen stable, store it below 30 degrees.

#### Expiry

Always check the date to make sure the sunscreen hasn't expired.

### **Broad Spectrum**

Protects against UVA and UVB radiation.

Even when wearing a hat, apply sunscreen to help protect from scattered and reflected UV reaching the face, neck and ears.

DNA damage that causes skin cancer accumulates with repeated UV exposure. Apply sunscreen daily.
