

GRADE 6 WELLBEING

INTERGENERATIONAL PEN PALS



In Wellbeing sessions last term, the Grade Six's were thrilled to each receive a personalised letter from a resident at Cherry Tree Grove retirement village. Intergenerational connections are beneficial for all ages. For our Grade Six's, it can provide an opportunity to broaden their perspectives, curiosity in others, and consider diverse life experiences. They noticed the importance of communicating in a respectful manner in their return letter as it was written to someone of the older generation. For older adults, it also has a range of benefits. Some of our pen pals were in their 80's, and the children were amazed when one writer noted his age at 95 years young. They read about residents who had come to Australia when they were younger by boat from Germany or England.



Another writer reflected on their life, stating they once wanted to be an Egyptologist but that 'life didn't always go the way you think and we went to live in the Bahamas instead'. Some cursive letters were hard to read and the class enjoyed attempting to decipher them. Others were hand made, included photos and expressed the excitement they had to learn more about their pen pal. The class were excited to write back and now we are all looking forward to their replies.


It has been a fantastic start to Term 2! It's lovely to see our students return from the holidays feeling refreshed and excited to learn.


In Maths, we've been learning all about Data and Statistics. The children have been collecting information using tally marks and are beginning to turn that information into simple graphs.

In F-1, students surveyed the class to find out whether they prefer playing at the park or the pool. After collecting the data, students created a graph to show the results. Overwhelmingly, more students in our classroom preferred the pool! We've also been learning how to look closely at graphs and talk about what they show us.

In the 1-2 classroom, students formulated their own questions and surveyed their classmates. After collecting tally marks for each choice, students made up graphs which we then analysed as a class.

You might like to find a topic at home that you can work with your child to make a graph about.

Is it really the end of Week Two? This term is already flying by! Might be something to do with ANZAC Day last Friday. To commemorate those fallen, we made traditional ANZAC biscuits in our Kitchen Garden rotations this week. Students from Years 3 to 6 worked together to make the traditional version of these biscuits, as published on the Australian War Memorial website. Some of us also got to try the ANZAC tiles, which were the traditional 'biscuits' the soldiers were given when they were serving overseas. We couldn't help but notice the huge difference in taste and texture between the recipes. The resounding response was that the ANZAC biscuit was so much tastier! Here we share the original recipe, which was published in <u>The Capricornian</u> on Saturday, 14th August 1926.

Ingredients

- 2 cups rolled oats
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1/2 cup melted butter
- 1 tbls golden syrup
- 2 tbls boiling water
- 1 tsp bicarbonate soda (add a little more water if mixture is too dry) Method
 - 1. Combine dry ingredients.
 - 2. Mix golden syrup, boiling water and bicarbonate of soda until they froth. Add melted butter.
 - 3. Combine butter mixture and dry ingredients.
 - 4. Drop teaspoons of mixture onto floured tray, allowing room for spreading.
 - 5.Bake in a slow oven.





SWPBS Snapshot

The Zones of Regulation is a helpful visual used to categorise the different ways we feel as we move through the four coloured zones. Students refer to the zones as they become increasingly aware of their emotions. They are encouraged to recognise when their feelings are rising towards to 'red zone' and guided to self-regulate towards the 'green zone' with calming strategies discussed during class time.


