Our Foundation to Year 2 students participate in weekly rotations that cover both STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Maths) and Kitchen Garden. This term in STEM, students have been exploring the fascinating world of living animals, focusing on their life cycles and what they need to survive. To bring this learning to life, we've had the pleasure of observing our rabbit, Smudge, and her four kittens.

We've watched these tiny, pink 'jelly beans' grow into fluffy, curious bunnies, gaining fur and taking their first hops out of the nest. Students have also had the chance to see Smudge's nurturing side as she cares for her kittens, providing a real-life example of animal parenting.

In Kitchen Garden students are observing the gradual changes in the garden that come as the weather cools. We always see creatures at work in the garden but students note that flying insects are less often seen at this time of year.

We also have to change our planting to winter plants that prefer winter conditions. During winter, crisp greens abound. We have planted peas, rainbow chard, globe artichokes and garlic. We discuss the time it takes for these different crops to be ready for harvest. They found it hard to believe that we'd be harvesting garlic near Christmas!







From 3/4A


3/4A students have been very busy during the past fortnight. In our daily PhOrMeS sessions we have consolidated our focus on the ee/ea spelling code and have moved into igh/ough. Each day we spend 15 minutes completing the Daily Review where we revisit what was covered in previous lessons. This ensures students store spelling rules and patterns into their long term memory, and can retrieve them with automaticity. Technically called 'retrieval practice', this strategy is directly related to the Science of Learning and Science of Reading.

In combination with our writing and reading sessions, we have been learning about Australian History and watching the ABC series 'My Place' to learn about the experiences of children through different times in history. Students have been working through persuasive texts and learning how facts and opinions can be used to sway readers to a specific point of view. We are now moving into Information Reports and this will continue for the remainder of the term.

In Mathematics we have been working on addition and subtraction problems by using open number lines. Students have also been working on solving various number problems using a wide variety of strategies. First, we present a specific problem they have to solve, then work with students to articulate what it is they are trying to work out and the best ways to do this.











From 4/5A

From 6A

Lord Somers Camp

Over the last fortnight, several of our 5/6 Students went on Lord Somers Camp. Here are some of their reflections...

Siena:

At Somers School Camp we had lots of fun activities including high ropes. At high ropes we had tight ropes and nets you had to climb. It was pretty high up and scary, but it was really fun. Only one person on each obstacle, so we had to wait. My teacher got stuck up on one of the obstacles, which was funny. I got stuck on a few obstacles, but I was fine.

Aidan:

The challenge swing was so fun! (And scary at the same time) after you got harnessed up you got given a number and that was the order of who was going to go first, I got number 15. After the first 14 people went, it was my go. I got clipped onto the rope and all the other people pulled me up once I got to the top, I pulled the cored that let me swing. For the first ¾ of the way down it felt like nothing was going to stop me from hitting the ground! Then I swung the other way again and again until it stopped. (the giant swing is 17 meters high.

Keziah:

On Somers camp we did a bush dance. We danced in groups to country music. We learnt dances. On one of the nights we did acting performances that we learnt beforehand. I did one called 'the ugliest person in the world'. There was a ringmaster and there was someone sitting on a chair with a blanket over them. We got people from our group to come out and 'say surely they can't be uglier than ____', when the blanket was removed, they were green.

And all the teachers were nice and supportive.


