Education Week





Physical Education

Congratulations to our APPS cross country team who competed in the Warrandyte South District Cross Country last week at Quambee Reserve, Ringwood. The students showed great determination and team spirit. Thank you to our parent helpers – we couldn't have done it without you!

In F–2 PE classes, we have been working on Fundamental Movement Skills. The students have been developing their ball skills, including bouncing a basketball with their fingertips, using different parts of their feet to manoeuvre a soccer ball, and exploring various ways to throw and catch. Teamwork is an important part of PE – working together as a group and encouraging each other. We have been exploring teamwork through parachute games and relays. The students can practise their skills at home by throwing or kicking a ball into a bucket or target.

The Grade 3–6 students have been continuing with athletics in preparation for our whole school and District Athletics. We have been learning the techniques for sprinting, long jump, triple jump, discus, and shot put. I have encouraged students to visit the local athletics track to practise their skills. We have also been discussing what it means to be coachable in sport. Interschool sport continues for our older students. The dates can be found in the School Calendar.

Please remember that PE is on Wednesdays. If it isn't raining, we will be outside, so dress warmly and remember to wear appropriate shoes for running and jumping.







From F1A

In Foundation and Year 1, students have been exploring the concept of addition. Our Foundation students have been focusing on 'Friends of Ten' (pairs of numbers that add up to ten) building a strong foundation for mental maths strategies. Meanwhile, our Year 1 students have been working with more complex addition problems involving numbers up to 50 and have recently begun exploring the connection between addition and subtraction. You can support your child's learning at home by encouraging incidental maths practice during everyday activities, such as adding prices while shopping or counting objects around the house. These real-life examples help reinforce classroom learning in fun and meaningful ways.

In the past weeks, we have been focussing on narrative writing in our Literacy lessons. We have been having lots of fun exploring fractured fairy tales. A fractured fairy tale is a story that starts with a traditional fairy tale but is changed in a fun and surprising way. The children began by planning their stories—thinking about how to change the characters, setting, or ending. What if the Big Bad Wolf was actually kind? What if our story was set in space (Luke Skywalker And The Three Sith?)


Once their ideas are ready, the students move on to draft their stories. After writing, we move onto developing our skills in editing - checking for correct use of uppercase letters, punctuation and reading through to check for word choice and sentence fluency. Finally, the best part: sharing their wonderful stories. We are so proud of the creativity, effort, and imagination shown by our young writers.

Literacy


This term in Literacy, students have taken a journey back in time to explore key moments in Australian history. They've investigated the impacts of colonisation during early settlement and followed the timeline through to the Australian Gold Rush. These rich discussions help students build their understanding of how the past has shaped present-day Australia.

Writing

In Writing, students have been developing their skills through the creation of information reports. They've chosen topics of interest, formulated their own research questions, and are now working to gather and organise relevant facts. This process supports critical thinking, curiosity, and independent learning.

Numeracy

In Numeracy, students have been practicing a variety of strategies to solve multi-digit addition and subtraction problems. By exploring different methods, they're becoming more flexible and confident mathematical thinkers, capable of approaching problems in ways that make sense to them.

PhOrMeS

Our new spelling program

Our school has adopted a new spelling program this year for 3-6 levels - PhOrMeS.

PhorMeS stands for:

Phonology - the sounds (codes) letters and combinations of letters make Orthology - spelling rules and patterns

Morphology (and Etymology) - the meaning of the parts of words and their history

Semantics - the part of language involved in meaning


PhOrMeS takes amore holistic approach to spelling and reading words. Through it we look that English isn't crazy - it's complex.

Over the last week, the Year 6 class have covered the Greek morpheme *bi*, meaning *life*. Students have worked with different prefixes and suffixes to get words like biography, bioluminescent, and autobiographical.

This week we've been looking at the Latin morpheme *rupt*, meaning *break/burst* from which we can build words like rupture, erupting, and interruption.

Ask your students about morphemes!


