

#### From 1-2

This week, we have been studying time in our Maths classes. Through hands-on activities and discussions, students have deepened their understanding of both short and long durations of time, while also developing key vocabulary such as before, after, hour, minute, days of the week, and months of the year. To connect learning with the real world, students have reflected on their own daily schedules, what they do in the morning, how long lunchtime lasts, and what activities take a whole day or just a few minutes. They've explored how long it takes to brush their teeth compared to a weekend away and even sorted events into those that take a second, a minute, or an hour. Choosing the appropriate measure of activities such as seconds for a race, or hours for a long journey. These rich experiences not only support numeracy but also foster independence and time management. By integrating real-life examples with the mathematical language of time, students are developing the foundational skills they need for life both inside and outside the classroom.







#### From F-2 - Kitchen Garden

At this time of year, the weather can be a little unpredictable. With the ground often wet underfoot, the Orchard isn't always available for gardening. However, there is always something to do in Kitchen Garden. While things may appear quiet above the ground, beneath the surface there is a world full of life and movement. Charles Kovacs once compared the earth to a galaxy of stars, filled with seeds and living things, all waiting for the right moment to grow. This week, students explored this hidden world, inspired by the beautiful picture book Above and Below. As part of our learning, students created detailed drawings of many fascinating creatures that live underground, worms and beetles. This creative activity helped them reflect on the important role these organisms play in keeping our soil healthy.

As gardeners, we know that healthy soil is the foundation of everything we grow.


