# It's not OK to be away...



# From 4/5A

Iln Literacy, students in 4/5 have been learning about the Latin base 'tract' and exploring how it helps them understand the meaning of unfamiliar words. They have also been practicing their inferring skills, which involve using clues from the text and their own knowledge to work out deeper meanings.

In Maths, students have explored a range of multiplication strategies that extend beyond the standard times tables, helping them solve more complex problems.

In Writing, students have continued learning about different types of poems and how they are structured, focusing on features such as rhyme, rhythm, and stanza formation.

### Ainslie Park Avenue, Croydon - Road Rehabilitation Works Notification

I refer to Council's previous correspondence dated 26 May 2025 regarding forthcoming road rehabilitation works for Ainslie Park Avenue in Croydon. As advised, Ainslie Park Avenue has been identified as requiring road rehabilitation due to the significant deterioration of the kerb & channel and road pavement.

I can advise that Council has appointed civil contractor CDN Constructors to undertake the works, which are scheduled to commence during the week of Monday 4 August 2025. It is anticipated that the works will be completed by the end of November 2025, with normal working hours of Monday to Friday from 7am to 5pm.

To facilitate a safe working environment for the public and the contractors, it is necessary to implement appropriate traffic controls as works progress. CDN Constructors have programmed works to be completed in segments to reduce overall impact to residents and manage traffic flow. The first road segment to be completed is between Anthony Street and the Council Carpark adjacent to the Ainslie Parklands Primary School.

It is anticipated that minor delays will occur throughout the works, however, the contractor will endeavour to minimise these delays as much as possible. CDN Constructors will also provide advanced notice to residents of any potential impact to property access.

Council thanks you for your patience as these critical infrastructure works are completed. For further information regarding the works, please see the attached Project Information document.



- Comprehensive psychological assessment of your child's anxiety
- Seven sessions of online counselling through video conferencing
- Parent-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) skills to help you manage and support your child's anxiety
- Two combined parent-child sessions
- · Reflective parenting strategies
- Access to a website with selfhelp materials to supplement therapy.

### Cost

\$20 per session/assessment. Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.
