


It's not OK to be away...(even if it is your birthday!!)

Today's incursion was an exciting opportunity for our F-2 students to immerse themselves in creative, hands-on exploration as part of our ongoing STEM unit on space, Earth, and community.

Students worked collaboratively to design their own communities and landscapes, using construction materials, dress-ups, and critical thinking skills. Working with others, they followed specific task briefs to build models. Students used their imagination to make models and demonstrate teamwork and creativity.

A highlight of the day was designing and building vehicles suited to different environments whether for land, space, or community transport.

The incursion was lots of fun and also supported our learning, reinforcing problem-solving, design thinking, and communication skills in an exciting way.

On Thursday, the 3/4s went on an excursion to Myuna Farm. We began the day by exploring sustainable gardening and the benefits of compost over chemical sprays. We learnt where our waste goes and how to recycle properly. We then got to visit the baby animals in the nursery, including day-old emu chicks!


We finished the day with our favourite activity, a train ride out to the wetlands, where we sampled the water to test its health. Then, a very exciting train ride back to the main part of the farm!

STEM in Year 6


This term in STEM, the year 6 class are learning about forces and inventions. Students have examined the needs people have and inventions to meet them.




